

Vance Middle School Band

Middle School is a fast-paced, fun-filled, fantastic time in life. Expect much from your time at Vance!

Bio

Mr. Spencer Finch is the band director at Vance Middle School Band. He also assists with the bands at Tennessee High School and the Elementary Schools located within the Bristol Tennessee City School district.



Before his current position at Vance, Mr. Finch directed bands at Sullivan East High School in Bluff City, TN (2006-2017) and at George Washington Community School in Indianapolis, IN (2004-2006).

Mr. Finch holds a Masters of Music from the American Band College / Sam Houston University (2017). And he received his Bachelors of Music Education from Brigham Young University (2003). His main instrument is the trombone.

Mr. Finch resides in Bristol, TN with his wife and 7 children.

Overview of Instrumental Music

7th Grade Band

Instruction is geared toward students that possess basic music knowledge and experience in playing an instrument. However, any student wishing to begin band at this level is welcome.

8th Grade Band

Students having grasped the instrumental music concepts presented in 7th grade move to a higher level skill set.

Both grade levels will perform for Music in the Castle, the Bristol Christmas Parade, our systemwide Winter Concert, and a Spring Concert.

Advanced Band

Students in 7th and 8th grade have the opportunity to participate in a full band class every day during AL time. They must have approval from the Band Director to join this class

Guitar

Guitar students will receive one semester of instruction in classical guitar technique and music reading skills. These students will not participate in the traditional "Band" performances.



Instrument Own or Loan

Personally Owned Instruments

Students that can, should purchase an instrument. Experience has shown that students develop a sense of responsibility, pride, and respect when they have to care for an instrument of their own.

Instrument Storage

Students will be provided a location to store their instruments at school during the day. However, due to a lack of space students will need to take their instruments home. The bright side to this is they can practice at home daily.

Loaner Instruments

Larger instruments are costlier to own and therefore Vance does provide a limited number of instruments for student use. These include tubas, baritone, French horns, trombones, and a motley assortment of other instruments.

Instrument-Switching Policy (district-wide policy)

- 1. Must have approval of the band director
- 2. Must purchase your own instrument (except in cases of Tuba, Baritone, Horn, Bassoon or excessively expensive instrument)
- 3. Must take private lessons outside of band class for 6 months (1 semester) before participating/performing on the new instrument
- 4. Must audition on new instrument for band director (i.e. play a certain number of scales that are age appropriate, prepared piece, etc.)

Band Karate



Band Karate is an assessment and incentive program for Junior Viking Band students. This will be an exciting adventure as students develop their instrumental music skills.

In "Band Karate" students will chart their progress by testing for "belts". Each belt represents a specific skill (or learning target) which one needs to master in order to play more challenging and fun music.

To show proficiency and meet the expected skill growth students will need to show mastery of two learning targets (belts) per quarter. Below you will see the rules for Band Karate. The belt requirements are found on the attached sheet.

Guidelines

- You will submit belt playing tests by recording the playing test on your own device or school laptop. Then email your recording to finchs@btcs.org. The subject line should include student name and the belt color.
- You must test for Belts in order: White, Yellow, Orange, Green, Blue, Purple, Red, and Black.

Beyond

For 8th grade students that complete their black belt, they may continue their progress by working toward the "Samurai" levels: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Students will receive a medal at the end of the year that corresponds to their highest achievement.



Music in the Castle

The Jr. Viking Band has the honor of opening the day's events at Music in the Castle. We will perform our National Anthem: The Star Spangled Banner. This year, the band competition takes place on **Saturday**, **October 5**, **2019**.

In addition to our performance, band students and parents are asked to work our fundraising booth in the *Alley* between the Castle and THS.

Students and parents can volunteer for a 4 hour shift at the booth. This volunteering can be counted towards student's Viking Promise.



Grading

Vance Middle School might be piloting a new grading system within the fine arts department this year. Band students will receive a score (0-4) for each of the 10 specific skills they are expected to master at this level of band. These skills include:

Written: Rhythms

• Written: Notes (Pitches)

• Written: Articulation

Terminology

• Performance: Tone Quality

• Performance: Rhythmic Accuracy

Performance: Note Accuracy

• Performance: Articulation

Key Signature and Scales

• Concert Performance/Etiquette

Performance Attendance

Students are required to participate in both concerts (winter and spring), *Music in the Castle*, and the Bristol Christmas Parade. Other performance opportunities will be announced as they are requested by the school system.


